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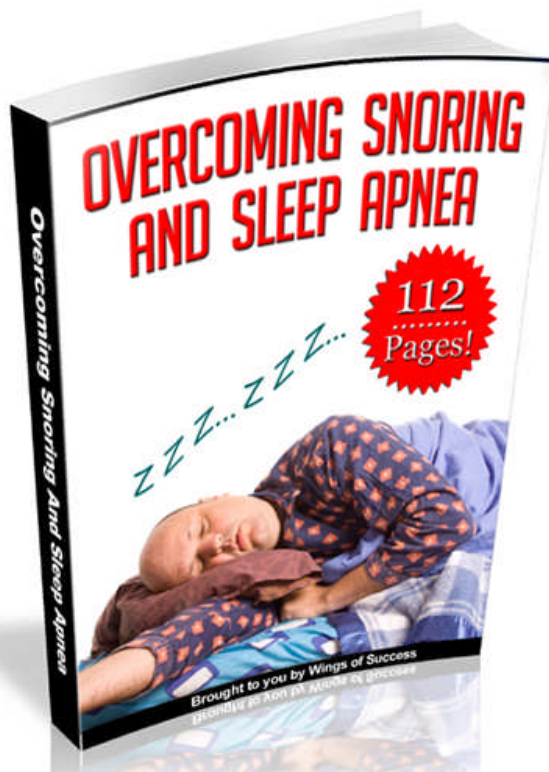
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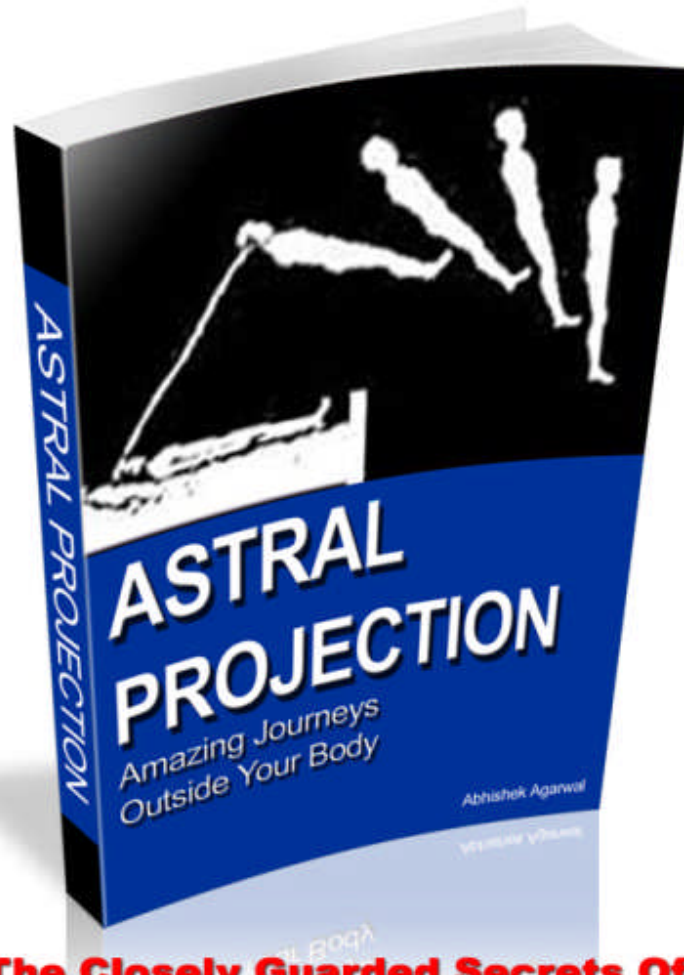
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What Is Sleep Apnea?

For most, this is a term that is not well known. There are a number of different reasons that you may have found yourself learning about this condition. The fact is that many suffer from it or may be having the early symptoms of it and they may not even realize it. Although that is the case for many, it doesn't have to be for you. Sleep apnea is a serious condition and should be taken with heart. But, before you become overwhelmed with your own needs, take the time to learn more about this condition so that you can improve your situation.

Sleep apnea is actually a disorder that happens when you are sleeping. You may have heard it called sleep apnea as well. In either case, the end result is the same. It is characterized by the fact that you have pauses in your breathing while you are sleeping. When this happens the episodes are called apneas. This term actually means without breath. The seriousness of your condition is defined, at times, by how long these episodes actually last. For some, it is just one missed breath while for others it can be many more. The bottom line is that this happens many times while you are sleeping and that leads to all sorts of complications, as you can imagine.

There are actually two different types of sleep apnea that you may be experiencing. Central and Obstructive are the two differences. In Central, you will find that the problem is caused by a lack of effort by your body. With Obstructive sleep apnea, there is something that is blocking or obstructive your ability to breathe properly.

If you are experiencing problems with breathing and you think that you may have sleep apnea, there is help out there for you. The first thing to do is to educate yourself and then seek out the help of a skilled doctor in the field. Testing can easily be done to help you to determine if this is something that is happening to you. In either case, it is necessary for you to find the solution to this problem as it can worsen.

Treatments For Central Sleep Apnea

If you have been diagnosed with central sleep apnea, then you already know just how serious your condition is. In this type of sleep apnea, your brain does not function as it should while you are asleep. It does not communicate with your muscles that they need to breath and that will cause you to wake up. When you do awake, you are likely to feel a shortness of breath. When this happens several times per night, it is important to talk to your doctor about the possible reasons behind it. If in fact central sleep apnea is the cause, then the doctor will work with you to find the right solution.

There are a number of different things that can be done to help improve your quality of life and minimize your risks of further problems. Although the treatment options for central sleep apnea are much less, they can work for those that need them.

- **Medical problems treated.** Since many times this type of sleep apnea happens due to some other medical condition it is necessary for those to be improved in order for the sleep apnea to be reduces. If you have such things as heart or neuromuscular disorders, getting help for them will improve your sleep apnea.
- **Adding Oxygen.** Another benefit that can be administered is that of increase oxygen. Your doctor may recommend having you have a supplemental form of oxygen added to your sleep. This will be done in one of various methods, as determined by your condition and by your needs. Here, they will force oxygen into the lungs, keep them full of the air that is required.
- **Positive airway pressure.** This can be needed too. In this case, you may wear what is called a CPAP machine which will force a higher pressured air into your airways. This will keep the airways open and encourage your lungs to have the necessary oxygen that you need.

Those that are suffering from central sleep apnea should take care in what the doctor requires them to do. Although it may seem difficult to wear a mask or it may seem like too much trouble to deal with oxygen at night, it is the difference between life and death in many cases.

Therefore, it is well worth it and in most cases, people will find ways to deal with it so that it becomes no problem at all.

Learning About Sleep Apnea

Have you been told that you possibly are suffering from sleep apnea? Although this may seem like a very scary situation to be in, many people suffer from it but go on to live very constructive lives. One thing to take note about this condition is that of when it happens. Obstructive sleep apnea is caused by something that is blocking the flow of air freely throughout your body. Your body wants to breath but your actual body is blocking your air way in some way. This is common in people that are overweight or that have large fleshy necks as the skin can cause the airway to become restricted. If you sleep on your stomach at night, this could happen to you as well. This type of apnea happens more often in older adults then it does in younger. It is also twice as commonly found in men as it is found in women.

When it comes to other forms of apnea, the risks are the same. It is important for you to understand what is happening to your body though. Therefore one of the first things that you doctor will recommend is a sleep study. Here, you enter the hospital or lab for an overnight stay. You are monitored while you are sleeping to find out just what is happening to you when you do close your eyes.

You can learn a great deal about sleep apnea if you visit your doctor and talk to your doctor about your condition. If you are looking for the right solution in how to treat it, the first things that need to be done are thorough testing. Once this is done your doctor is likely to recommend the next steps to take to handle it.

What Are The Symptoms Of Sleep Apnea?

When it comes to sleep apnea, it is something that worries many. The fact is that many people are not sleeping correctly or that they sleep for a full eight hours and wake up feeling as if they didn't sleep at all. Sleep apnea can be the cause of this. More often than not, you won't know that you have this condition but will go to see your doctor because you are just tired all the time. Many people find themselves shocked to hear that something was wrong with their actual sleeping patterns. In fact, many don't realize that anything at all is happening to them.

What are the symptoms that you should look for? No matter what type of sleep apnea that you have, obstructive or central, your symptoms are likely to be about the same. This can make it a bit more difficult to determine what type of apnea you actually suffer from. Here are some of the symptoms that you are likely to be facing.

- **Hypersomnia.** You may be tired during the day even though you have slept through the night.
- **Snoring.** One of the most common symptoms that most people face is that of snoring. There is no doubt that snoring can be tiresome, but it can also be a sign of something much more serious. If your snoring wakes up your spouse, then it is time to talk to your doctor about it.
- **Morning headaches.** These are another common sign of sleep apnea.
- **Breathing Cessation.** You may actually observe or notice yourself waking up for no reason in the middle of the night. Or, someone else may notice that you are doing this. Again, your spouse is a great help in spotting this condition.
- **Dry mouth.** Often, those that suffer from this condition will wake up with the feel of a dry mouth or even a sore throat.
- **Insomnia.** Many of those that suffer from sleep apnea have insomnia or the condition in which they just can not fall asleep and stay asleep. There may be nothing else causing this to happen.

If you wake up with a shortness of breath, it is likely that you will be facing central sleep apnea. If you are more commonly snoring loudly, this is characterized by obstructive sleep apnea. Nevertheless, if you face any of these problems, it is necessary to talk to your doctor about your condition as soon as possible.

What Is Causing My Obstructive Sleep Apnea?

Are you having episodes of waking up at night? Is your spouse considering kicking you out of bed because your snoring has gotten so loud? These are signs and symptoms of obstructive sleep apnea. Although it will take a trained doctor to tell you if you do in fact suffer from this condition, it is still something that you may find yourself facing. If and when that happens, it is necessary for you to consider seeking out the help of a doctor to determine what the necessary next step is.

One thing that most that have been told they may have this are wondering is just what is it that causes sleep apnea? There could be several things that cause this condition to effect you. First of all, the causes for the condition have the same result. In obstructive sleep apnea, the muscles that are located in the very back of your throat relax. What is important to know is that those muscles are actually responsible for supporting the soft palate, the piece of tissue that hangs from the soft palate which is called the uvula and the tonsils and tongue as well.

When this happens to you, your airway is closed off or narrows too much. When you breathe in to take a breath, you can't bring that air into your body and that causes your breathing to stop for that moment. When you miss the breaths that your body requires, your level of oxygen drops considerably and that alarms your brain. To handle this problem the brain tells you to wake up to handle it. In most cases, you will wake up for such a brief second that you don't remember that you even did it.

Sleep apnea of this type of can happen to you over and over again during the night. In some cases it will happen 10, 20 or even 30 times per hour all night long. As you can imagine there is no way for the body to reach deep sleep which is how your body actually rests and becomes recharged. When you can't reach this level of sleep, you probably will wake up and feel as if you didn't sleep at all. Many will find themselves feeling tired during the day too.

Why Do I Have Central Sleep Apnea?

Central sleep apnea is a condition that many people face and it can be quite alarming. In fact, just being told that you have this condition may be very scary. What do you mean you don't breathe while you are sleeping? That may be what you say right to your doctor. The fact is that during this type of sleep apnea, the conditions are often more serious than with obstructive sleep apnea. In fact, it is often important to realize that if you do have it, it is necessary for you to take actions to correct or manage it successfully.

What Happens?

During central sleep apnea, your body lacks that effort to breath. Unlike obstructive sleep apnea, the body doesn't have anything that is blocking it from taking air in. In fact, it doesn't have any problems with the airways. Rather, the body has a problem telling itself to breath. Central sleep apnea is much, much less common then that of obstructive sleep apnea.

In this type of sleep apnea, your brain is where the problem lies. As you know, the brain controls all of the necessary movements and systems in your body. Even when you are sleeping, your brain is working to control things like your breathing. But, when you suffer from central sleep apnea, your brain is making the mistake of not telling your body to breath. Rather, it is not transmitting the necessary signals to your muscles to breath.

When this happens, you wake up feeling like you are out of breath. You may feel like you can't catch your breath. You may face some pretty serious headaches when you awake as well. There are other symptoms that can be found too, but most often the fact that you remember waking up and feeling as if you can't catch your breath is a warning sign that many doctors take very seriously.

If you have been told that this is a possible cause of your sleeping problems, it is time to talk to your doctor about it. In addition, if you face any of these conditions and remember waking up and experiencing that shortness of breath, it is important that you seek out medical help as these can worsen making sleeping near impossible to do.

Am I At Risk For Sleep Apnea?

Did you know that many times people can avoid having sleep apnea? If you are someone that experiences shortness of breath when you wake at night, you may actually have a form of sleep apnea is that much rarer called central sleep apnea. This condition is one in which the brain fails to tell your muscles to breath. Nevertheless, the more common type of sleep apnea is that of obstructive sleep apnea. In this situation, individuals have something blocking their air ways and although they are trying to breath, they can't do it.

But, what makes you a candidate for this condition? There are actually several things that could be causing you to face this illness.

- **Overweight.** If you are overweight, excess weight may be playing a role in the problem. If you have extra weight that develops around the upper airway of your body, you may face obstruction in your breathing which can lead to sleep apnea. Although you may not be overweight, if enough weight develops in this specific area you may be effective (you don't have to look overweight to have to deal with it.)
- **The Size of Your Neck.** Those that have a larger sized neck may also fall victim to sleep apnea. If you have a neck that is larger than 17 inches in its circumference, then you have an increased ability to have sleep apnea.
- **Narrow Airway.** For some people, a narrow airway is just a natural thing and can even be a hereditary condition. In addition, if you have tonsils or adenoids that have become enlarged, you too may be more at risk of developing sleep apnea. These can block the air from flowing easily.
- It is more likely that older people will experience sleep apnea over younger people.
- More men will fall victim to sleep apnea then women will. If you are a woman and are overweight, though, you do have more of a risk than someone that is not overweight.

Sleep apnea is an important condition to have examined. If you have these risk factors and realize that you have some of the symptoms that can lead to sleep apnea, it is essential to talk to your doctor about it. Many times people do not realize that they could be facing a condition that is vitally important to handle.

Testing For Sleep Apnea

Take a few minutes to find out if you have any of the risk factors or the symptoms of sleep apnea. If you do, contact your doctor to find out what the next step in the process is. One thing that you should realize is that sleep apnea is something that can be hard to diagnose. Yet, it is very important that it is diagnosed successfully. Therefore, you are likely to undergo several different types of treatments to find out if in fact you are suffering from this condition. There are several tests that will likely be done on you to determine if you suffer from sleep apnea, what type it is and to what extent you are suffering. In most cases, you will first want to visit a sleep specialist who will handle determining which tests are important for you to take as well as how they will work. In most cases, an overnight evaluation is a must. You will need to monitor how well your breathing is happening during the night as well as your oxygen levels and other body functions.

One of these tests is that of the nocturnal polysomnography. When you have this test, you will have equipment that is placed on you to monitor what is happening with your heart, your brain, and your lungs. It will also look at the breathing patterns that you have during the night. Your arms and legs will be monitored as well. This test is likely to be the first one that you have. It will give the doctor a clear look at if in fact you have sleep apnea.

Two other tests may be needed next. The oximetry test involves just a small device that is fitted over your finger and is completely painless. It will monitor the amount of oxygen in your blood at any time. The portable cardio-respiratory testing device may also be required. Here, you will be able to take the device home with you and it will determine what is happening with your oxygen levels and your breathing while you sleep.

All of these tests are necessary and they are a window into what is happening with your own condition. You will find them to be easy to handle and they give your doctor clear views of what is happening and what to do next.

What Can Sleep Apnea Do For You?

If you have sleep apnea, you may think that the only thing that can happen to you is that you wake up for no real reason and you find yourself unable to get a good night's sleep. But, this is far from the only thing that can happen to you when you have sleep apnea. In many ways, it can worsen or cause complications that are life threatening. Although it is not uncomfortable some worry that it will be. What it does is keeps your airways open and that is true benefit to you. To do this, the machine applies a larger amount of air pressure than is in the current air. By doing this, it forces, gently, the airways to stay open, allowing you unrestrictive flow.

Another choice for treating obstructive sleep apnea is to use what is called an oral device. This device is used to keep the breathing airways open while you are sleeping. These are easier to use than the CPAP machine will be, but they don't do as good of a job making it happen.

Finally, in some cases, it may be necessary to have surgery to improve your airway flow. This may or may not be an option for you. One thing to note is that you and your doctor will determine the right method for handling your sleep apnea together and that trial and error may be the best method for improving your quality of life.

Pick A Pillow To Help Stop Snoring

We've all heard the argument that if you elbow a snorer and they roll over, their snoring will stop. In some cases this actually works and after rolling over, the snorer and the person doing the elbowing both get a good and quiet night's rest.

There are devices that you can purchase that help the snorer to sleep in a position that encourages less snoring. The idea behind them is that if the snorer's body is in a certain position the airway through their throat will be more open and that allows a clearer passage of air. For some people it might mean lying on their side with two or three pillows under their head. In this case it's just about experimenting with the number of pillows and adjusting them so that the snorer is not only comfortable but the snoring stops.

There are specialty pillows that can be purchased that create a contour under the neck of the person who snores. This contour works as a method of opening up the throat and generally they are designed to aid the snoring problem regardless of which position the snorer sleeps in, whether it's his or her back or side. These can be quite costly so it's important to research them before investing in one.

Another overlooked aspect of pillows is that they can contain products that the snorer might be allergic to. This results in an accumulation of mucous in the person's throat which results in their snoring. Not connecting the two can lead to years of snoring problems without recognizing that the pillow is the culprit. By changing to a pillow made with another material, the snoring may stop.

Nose Strips: Can They Help Stop Snoring?

Within the past few years the problem of snoring has become more of an issue. People are discussing it more and researchers are trying to come up with new and inventive ways for dealing with the problem.

One of those new ideas involves the use of strips that adhere to the skin of the nose. They are found under various brand names, but their goal is common, and that goal is to stop snoring.

The premise for how they work is that the snorer applies an adhesive strip to their nose. It lays across the bridge of their nose in a horizontal fashion. At first glance it resembles the type of adhesive strip that a person would use to cover a cut or a scrape. But instead of the strips designed for snoring is a narrow thick material when applied helps to open the nostrils. The idea is that when the nose is held open the person it is applied to will not snore because they are able to breathe without obstruction.

The strips are discreet in that they are not applied until the person is going to bed. They don't need to be worn during the day and they rarely cause an allergic reaction so it's not obvious to anyone that you have worn them.

They are effective in many people. People claim that by using the strips, their snoring has stopped completely. They have found relief in one of the most natural ways possible without consuming any medications at all.

- Sing in the shower if you can, the steam will help lubricate your throat muscles which also helps with snoring.

Beware: Sleeping Pills Can Actually Worsen Snoring

For someone who has difficulty sleeping, having a sleep aid such as a sleeping pill can seem almost a lifesaver. If a person has slept restlessly for months or even years, being able to take something and then fall into a deep sleep can seem like a wonderful solution.

That deep sleep might also result in snoring. For those around the person sleeping away under the influence of a sleeping pill, it can mean a night without any sleep at all.

When we take a sleeping aid, our body relaxes to a point that we feel exhausted and naturally drift off to sleep. Our throat muscles become relaxed at the same time and this can result in snoring. Stopping the snoring might mean stopping the sleeping aid.

Often when a person is having difficulty sleeping they attribute that to stress or being overworked. The problem might be right in front of their eyes though. The problem might be that because of their snoring, they aren't sleeping. When they take a sleeping aid the snoring problem just worsens.

Their body is so relaxed and they are in such a deep sleep that the snoring can actually become dangerous and be a symptom of sleep apnea which is when the person stops breathing. Therefore it's important to recognize that although the sleeping aid is beneficial it might also be damaging to the snorer.

In this case, when the person does have a snoring problem, it's important to find the cause of the snoring, whether that's being overweight, being allergic to something or sleeping in the wrong position. Although sleeping pills might help the snorer get a great night's rest, others will feel the opposite and long for a peaceful sleep free of the sounds of snoring.

Causes Of Snoring In Children

It might not be an abnormal occurrence for children to snore, since about 12 percent of them snore from one year to nine years. But, if your child is snoring, do not take it for granted, you should take that child for medical examination to actually determine the cause of snoring as to certify the safe health of the child.

If your child snores consistently, it might be a result of OSAS known as sleep apnea syndrome. In this case, the child's snore might be very loud and he or she is usually restless through the night because of the uncomfortable breathing conditions. This will lead to the child waking up several times at night, and each time he or she returns to sleep, the loud snore continues immediately. This is not a usual occurrence for most children, but every parent must be aware of some of the factors that might indicate the existence of the sleep apnea (OSAS).

Most of the factors that indicate this condition are:

The lack of the ability to pronounce words perfectly. The child will experience a speech impediment making it difficult to speak clearly.

The child will experience retardation in growth since all his or her energy is used up while breathing. This also makes it difficult for the child to eat well, because of the struggle to breathe and eat at the very same time - this makes the feeding time a very slow process.

Because of lack of proper sleep the child experiences the feeling of drowsiness and in the effort to be alert hyperactivity becomes the end point.

It will be discovered that the child educational performance in school is not good, because of the lack of peaceful sleep at night.

If you notice these signs in your child, it will probably mean he or she has a sleep apnea and in that case, a visit to the pediatric doctor will be recommended as this issue will be analyzed with medical examinations to get a treatment suitable for the child. When treated the child's performance at school will improve since sufficient sleep is denied at night.

There are also other factors that cause snoring in children apart from sleep apnea (OSAS), and they are:

Children suffering from asthmatic conditions snore, because this ailment affects the respiratory system, thus producing snoring while the child sleeps.

When the adenoids of a child is enlarged as a result of the infiltrations of allergies bringing about the inflammation of nasal linings, the child snores. This is because the breathing process of the child is impaired and every thing returns back to normal once the allergy is treated.

Children suffering from obesity will also snore, statistics show that about 40 percent children suffering from obesity snore. In this case, there are obstructions produced in the respiratory pathways of air as a result of the accumulation of fat round about the throat region. Too much fat can also result to the malfunctioning of the diaphragm which can also result to snoring.

When a child experiences cold, the organs in the nasal and respiratory cavities are enlarged leading to snoring. If the adenoid is enlarged it can also cause snoring. These two conditions if treated will bring about the end to the snoring sound produced by the child while sleeping.

Other instances like the inability of the muscles and nerves of the child to handle the movement of the air passages in the respiratory tract can lead to snoring. When the child's jaw was not properly developed, snoring can be the resultant problem.

Factors that Cause Snoring

There are in reality so many factors that leads to snoring and most of these factors vary from person to person; however, there are some major root causes of snoring.

Snoring is the noisy disturbance produced by the movements of airflow during sleep. It is the noise emitted when there is a restriction experienced in the out flow and in flow of air in the respiratory passages.

It has been observed that this noise called snoring is usually experienced only during sleep. This makes me wonder why the noise is only made when an individual is asleep. If one will snore, why not during ant time of the day, especially when awake, but this is not possible, because the snoring sound is a product of muscles that are relaxed and inactive. When the respiratory muscles are active, there can not be snoring.

The vibration occurs only during sleep, because of the softness of the different parts of the respiratory system at the point of sleep, all these organs are relaxed, hence the noise of snoring becomes obvious.

There are different types of snores as a result of the disparity in the level of sounds produced varying from one person to another. The level of the produced sound is directly proportional to the level of strength with which the air passing through the respiratory passages. If the air passage is very forceful, then, the sound of the snore be very high and vice versa. In this case even a baby can snore, but the sound produced in this case is very mild and makes no visible difference, since the air passes with very little force or strength.

The act of snoring while sleeping is common to both men and women at all ages, but studies have proved that men of middle ages are more prone to the attack of snoring than others. In general men are more affected by snoring than women, because of the differences in the structure of the neck. The neck of a man is larger than that of a woman and other organs in the respiratory system differs, leading to the sexual disparity in snoring. This in conjunction with the fact that the forcefulness of air passages are higher in men than in women.

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Furthermore, the production of the birth hormones called progesterone in women also makes them less prone to snoring, because these hormones produced during pregnancy and lactation prevents snoring since it gives remedy to the act of snoring. It has also been discovered that some devices to stop snoring actually contain these hormones as an antidote to snoring.

Apart from these above mentioned, some other factors below can cause snoring:

1. If someone is obsessed, snoring can not be avoided.
2. Drunkenness can also cause snoring.
3. If you are experiencing flu with cold, the nasal passages might be blocked leading to snoring.
4. Other factors can also block the air passages such as allergies leading to snoring.
5. Some drugs can dry up the nasal passages.
6. The cavities of the nose can thicken resulting to snoring
7. If you have a large belly, snoring is un avoided.
8. With a tongue that is large, the respiration will be blocked causing snoring.
9. If you use too much sprays nasally, snoring occurs.
10. Smoking of cigarettes leads to inflamed air paths causing snoring.

Top Anti Snoring Devices You Can Avail

It is not in any way interesting to be in the same room with a person that snores, the level of closeness or the amount of love shared between the two parties becomes insignificant when it comes to dealing face to face with snoring. It does not matter if the person snoring is your mother, spouse, friend or even the love of your life - it is very annoying and irritating to sleep in the same bedroom with a snorer. In fact, I can not stand being in the same house with such an individual.

Through the intervention of scientists that are carrying out unending researches to eradicate the snoring habit, some devices have been produced to help snorers all over the world. And some of the best devices to stop snoring are listed below:

Nasal Dilators

This is a device used to open up the passages through which air enters and flows out of the nose. It is fabricated from either plastic or coil of stainless steel.

Pillows to Stop Snoring

These are special pillows produced to help the snorer position himself or herself rightly so as to avoid snoring. When an individual sleeps in the wrong position, the out flow and in flow of air through the respiratory tract is hampered or restricted bringing about snoring. So, the pillow is designed to solve this problem.

Snore Balls

To a snorer, it is very important to have the right sleeping posture and the best position to sleep is by the sides. When someone prone to snoring sleeps on his or her back there is always an increased tendency to snore while sleeping. This is the actual reason for the snore balls; a tennis ball, golf ball, or even a base ball can be used. All you need to do is place it at the back, so that whenever you try to sleep on your back, the sharp pain experienced will make you do otherwise; causing you to remain on your sides. This is painful but very effective.

Nasal Strips

These are strips put into the nose to keep the flow of air constant. In this case there is a free constant flow of air through the nose to every part of the respiratory organ making it easy to breathe, hence there will be no snoring. This device is also utilized by athletes during exercises or competitions.

Throat Spray

The throat spray is a combination of natural components mixed to produce a special spray which the snorer can use before sleeping on his or her throat to eradicate snoring. But one has to be very careful about the throat spray since an excessive use of it can cause more harm than good.

Sleep Position Monitor

It is very clear that to stop snoring, a person must always adopt the habit of sleeping in the right position. If this is not adhered to the habit can not be eradicated. The best sleeping position is by the sides. The sleep posture monitor releases a sharp beep whenever the person attempts to sleep in the wrong position. This instrument is not the best choice, especially if the person trying to stop snoring does not live alone, because the beeps will disturb his or her room mate.

Apart from the natural factors like sleeping position or restricted air flow through the respiratory tract; there are other factors that causes snoring medically, so, the best option is to carry out a medical examination first before choosing the method of treatment. What ever treatment is prescribed, follow the prescription strictly and the snoring will be overcome.

A Change In Lifestyle Is A Good Remedy To Stop Snoring

Its been proven that approximately 45 percent Americans snore often. And its shocking to know that almost 80 percent of them sleep in different rooms, and even worse is to know that couples have actually divorced, thanks to snoring.

Snoring creates some sort of stress in a relationship, and also a complex of a different sort. This does not just affect your partner, but also you, just think, in spite of all the beauty, if one snores during their sleep, it will be awful, not just for them, but for people around also.

So, snoring must not be pushed aside thinking that its some simple thing.

Snoring can lead to diabetes, unbelievable, isn't it? That is what is up for us in the recent surveys. The logic behind this is simple, snoring cuts down the intake of oxygen, which leads to a situation where a lot of catecholamines are produced. Thus, you can be attacked by diabetes.

Before we hit the treatments to prevent snoring, let us discuss about the root cause that leads to snoring. How many of us have questioned as to why people snore? The answer is here, when we sleep, the air passing through our nose then to the throat and then to the lungs move noiselessly, but for many people, there might be some sort of obstruction in the air flow. The reasons might be clogged nose or something else, but whatever it is, it just hampers the airflow.

Usually, snoring is caused by the tissue that is soft, in the throat, which vibrates, thus, the airway is clogged, and it passes to the lungs, and it creates a noise. The snoring is due to the air passing across the tissue there.

Anything done in excess, like, smoking, drinking, eating, are all things that can make this problem worse. And not doing these are methods by which one can prevent snoring, before leaping to other hard attempts to prevent snoring, like surgery.

A good guide to follow, in case snoring is to be prevented:

- Never take too much of food before you crash, take a good three hour rest before going to sleep, and after taking your final meal.
- A balanced diet is another thing that is important to keep snoring at bay.
- Burning the excess calories by exercising is another important thing.
- Allergies are to be checked by keeping the surroundings clean.
- Never leave the window open when you sleep.
- Fatigue must be prevented, and a normal sleep schedule must be followed.

Causes Of Snoring And Finding Treatment Through Surgery

One of the greatest problems and one of the most common one during sleep is snoring. Its not as bad as dying, but still, snoring sure has its own problems tagged along, that are really grave. There are many other problems that might root from snoring.

This is a common phenomenon in men who are classified in the middle age, and more with the men who are obese. This has a probability with fat men, as they have enlarged and flesh filled throats, whose muscles might collapse when relaxed.

Snoring has its roots from the airflow in the passage that is between the nose and the throat. The relaxation of tissues will only make the passage more narrow. This is the possible answer for people asking why we snore only when we are relaxed.

The airflow in the narrow air passage along the relaxed muscles in the throat invariable initiate a vibration. The muscle relaxes and the tongue falls back and waits for the muscle to be relieved off the tension that is thrown on it.

A blocked nose can also contribute to this situation, as the space in the nose becomes limited and less air passes through, so, sometimes, the snoring occurs only when a person has heavy cold, or profound sinus.

Snoring can be an effect of the position in which one person sleeps, if he sleeps on his back, then, the tongue naturally falls back , and the throat muscles are pulled by gravity. So, people are generally suggested to sleep in the sideward position.

The relaxation of muscles in the throat is the culprit, it is unwanted and this causes the airflow to get lessened and the respiratory tract and the nasal paths are troubled, so, its better to get the excess muscles fixed.

The real cause for the snoring is only found when an otolaryngologist inspects it. The specialist will surely be able to find the reason, and the other problems related to the ear, the nose and the throat.

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The surgery conducted on you to stop snoring is called the uvulopalatoharyngoplasty, acronym as UPPP, it is just widening the passages for airflow. This process removes the tissues that are excessive in the throat and that narrows down the passage.

A more intensive one is the Laser uvulopalatoharyngoplasty.

Both are done on mild snorers, but don't have the desired effect with people suffering from apnea.

Nasal surgery is one way to help people from snoring, and it is recommended to people whose nasal septum is blocked.

There is another method where the tongue is kept from falling back, and it is called to Tongue Suspension Procedure. Here, the tongue is stitched below with the lower jaw with the help of a small screw.

The throat tissue plays a major role in snoring, so shrinking it will ultimately give you a solution. The name of the method to shrink your excess tissue in the throat by releasing energy with the help of electrode needles is called Somnoplasty. This, later is absorbed back by the body.

Surgery is not one of the most preferred and the simplest ways of fixing the sloppy throat muscles. But it sure is the ultimate solution to snoring. But, it is best to discuss this with the physician, and he will give the best method to help you from snoring.

Snoring Cure: What Are They?

You might find people who snore funny, but you just won't feel the same way when the person you sleep with snores into your ear every night. It in fact will annoy you. This is the driving force behind curing snoring.

The following are some methods to control or if possible cure snoring:

1. Respiratory Exercises: Snoring is mainly caused by blocks in the breathing passage like the nose and throat due to nose blockades, wrongly position jaws or an over-strained throat. To resume normal breathing, take many deep breaths to relax the muscles of your throat

2. Decongestants: Nasal congestion can also cause snoring. Since the nose is blocked, the person may try to breathe through the mouth leading to snoring. To clear these blockades, take decongestants.

3. Anti-allergy medications: Enlargement of adenoids might have been cause by allergy to some drug previously prescribed. Once a person gets over the allergy, snoring stops.

4. Healthy diet and exercise: Most obese people snore. This is not just a coincidence. The concentration of fat in the air passage, limits air from flowing freely in and out. The proper functioning of the diaphragm is also hindered by fat accumulation in the stomach resulting in snoring. 4 in 10 obese people are known to snore. Good exercise and a healthy diet will not alone help them overcome snoring, but will also benefit them in numerous ways.

5. Change your bed position: Sleeping in the wrong position may also induce snoring. For example, you might stretch your neck too much by using too many pillows. Using a single pillow can avoid this. Lying on your back may also cause snoring.

6. Lifestyle change: Intake of alcohol and snoring may directly or indirectly induce snoring. For example, certain medical complications caused by drinking might have caused snoring. To maintain good health, it is therefore advisable to quit alcohol and smoking. This also improves all-round health and mental peace.

7. Medication: Sleeping pills, antihistamines, certain other medicines can cause an increase in snoring.

8. Sleep Pattern: Basically, there are two periods of sleep, the REM sleep and stage 1 sleep. A person dreams constantly in REM sleep and experiences deep sleep often. Stage 1 sleep will be experienced while sleeping or if a person sleeps poorly. Both these can lead to unstable breathing which in turn causes snoring. If you don't sleep at around the same time everyday, the irregularity may cause instability in respiration and thus cause unstable breathing when you sleep.

9. Salt water nasal drops: Congestion in the nose may be caused by mucus and this can both spoil your sleep and also cause snoring. If you want to avoid this, purchase a small bottle of salt water nasal drops at any drugstore in your neighborhood. These help flush down the mucus. If you are not willing to buy a bottle, these nasal drops can be made right at home by dissolving a teaspoon of salt in roughly 250 ml of water. Once this water cools to the natural temperature of the body, put a dropper in it and use it.

If any other serious condition like sleep apnea or enlargement of tonsils and/or adenoids, surgical procedures such as Laser Assisted Uvula Palatopathy commonly abbreviated as LAUP and somnoplasty or radio frequency tissue ablation can be undertaken. This is more than sufficient proof that the root cause of snoring must be determined prior to taking action.

Did you wonder why we tend to snore only when we are sleeping? When we sleep, our upper airway muscles relax and they wilt inward. This makes passage of air through the wind pipe tougher and hence apnea (stoppage of breathing of small instants) occurs which leads to snoring.

When apnea occurs, there is an increase in Carbon dioxide levels in the body. In response to this, the heart rate gets affected and our blood vessels get narrowed. Thus the more time for which these muscles relax, the more the people snore.

There are people who do not realize that they are snoring. They toss and turn and wake up tired losing good quality sleep. Some people, when half-awake, even hear themselves snoring. Obesity, smoking, drinking, tonsillitis, sinusitis, common cold may all lead to snoring.

Snoring is closely linked to overweight people. This is because there is fat concentration on the airways that limits the air to go in and out freely. Losing weight will greatly help these people to stop snoring.

Consume healthy food and exercise everyday. Though it may seem unrelated, exercising is found to be very effective in getting rid of snoring. A relaxed jaw can work wonders in reducing snoring.

Ways To Prevent The Causes Of Snoring

Snoring is way too common. But does this mean you can ignore it? Many do, but let us see why snoring is not insignificant.

It is caused by air striking loose tissues in the neck. When the entire body relaxes, even these muscles tend to relax and they cause a person to snore. If you ever wondered why we snore only when we are asleep, this would have answered your question. When you are awake, these muscles are taut and so air flows through freely. But when you sleep, they tend to droop and thus we snore.

When the tongue falls back into the throat, the pressure in the throat is increased exponentially leading to difficulty in passage of air. So air cannot flow like it did before. When the air passing strikes the back of the tongue, the tongue vibrates producing the drumming sound labeled by us as the snore.

People who approach physicians for curing snoring are often asked to lie on their sides since lying on their back can lead to excess relaxation of neck muscles effectively cutting down the amount of air that passes. Gravity will cause these tissues to dangle and the tongue to roll back into the throat. This leads to snoring.

One of the earliest and simplest devices to keep a person from snoring is a tennis ball stitched inside a sock attached to the back of a snorer's pajama. This restricts a person from lying on his back. So he sleeps on his side instead and relieves himself of the snore.

The most common victims of snoring are the obese. There are far more loose, flabby tissues in their neck and this forms a greater barrier to the flow of air leading to snoring. The loudness of one's snore is often proportional to the amount of excess fat one has.

The best way to prevent snoring is to keep your weight under check. Not alone will you avoid snoring but you will also be saved from various cardiac diseases, impairments and you will start feeling more confident

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Choose the best way to lose weight. This could be gymming or a jog or yoga. Don't rush it up. Rome was not built in a day. So weight accumulated gradually will be lost gradually. Speeding it up can lead to adverse results. Keep exercising and also stick to a strict diet. It will pay ten fold.

Substances that induce relaxation can also trigger snores. Do not consume Do not get too tired on any given day. Work within your limits, else you may relax too much leading to snoring.

Sleep at around the same time everyday. When the body gets used to this, it relaxes more and this gives you better sleep. Thus even if your snoring disturbs your partner, you are less likely to be awakened by this annoying grunt.

Smokers are found to have a greater chance to start snoring than non-smokers. Smoking is linked with way too many health hazards that can even prove life-threatening and fatal. Snoring is not fatal, but it can cause a lot of discomfort and losing sleep can indirectly lead to hypertension and cardiac problems. It makes you lose certain specific pleasures too.

The smoke and the substances in the cigarette smoke cause the esophagus's cells to react. The obese are more prone to start snoring than those who have their weight under control. The heavier a person becomes, greater are the chances that he will start snoring when he is asleep. Snoring doesn't start only because the person is obese. The likelihood increases because when a person becomes fatter, he will have more tissues in the airway in his neck.

Since these tissues obstruct normal flow of breath, snoring might occur.

A few others start snoring because of some form of allergy.

There are a dozen other reasons to why you snore. The only way to find out is to devise ways to find out! A general physician might be able to find out the reason. But if you want to have the best evaluation done, consult an otolaryngologist who is a specialist in throat, mouth and nose problems and their cures.

Snoring By Nature Is...

Ever since a pioneer invented a device for curing snoring by attaching a sock with a tennis ball to the back of a shirt to prevent him/her from lying on the back, hundreds of other inventions have been made in the same field. These devices, sadly, initiate a very unpleasant stimulus every time you snore or do anything that can trigger snoring. Snoring is not a voluntary action. So if a device does keep you from snoring, it might also keep you awake all night.

Abnormality of the air passage is the root cause of snoring. When free flow of air which is required for normal breathing is hindered by some problem, it is highly likely that air strikes the back of the nose and mouth continuously. This vibration comes out as snoring.

Many people take snoring lightly imagining that it will not cause any harm. Contrary to this, people who suffer from snoring may in the long run, have serious health problems like obstructive sleep apnea. Apart from this, they cannot get a good night's rest and thus are deprived of complete rest. Also, it may embarrass the person and also disturb his/her spouse/bedmate.

Obstructive sleep apnea is a condition where snoring is interspersed with instants where the person completely stops breathing. These instances may occur for 10 seconds each upto 10 times each hour. Thus the sufferer may have 30 to 300 such episodes in a single night.

These reduce the oxygen levels in our blood and causes the heart to pump harder than normal.

A person is forced to sleep only lightly so that he can keep his muscles taut. Only this can regulate normal flow of air in a person's air pipe. This unrelaxed rest is not sufficient for the human body. This makes him less productive for the entire day and also lead to heart enlargement and heightened blood pressure

The following are some of the contributors to snoring:

Anatomy of the mouth

Tissues in the air passage are some of the factors of snoring. Narrowing of the air passage is itself a chief cause of snoring. Elongated soft palette, thickened soft palette, enlarged tonsils can all cause narrowing of this passage. All these cause obstruction of free air flow.

Drinking just before bedtime:

Most of the effective causes of snoring are those which make the throat muscles relax in excess. Alcohol being a sedative does just this. It acts as a relaxant on the throat muscles. Thus, consumption of alcohol just before sleeping can cause snoring.

Apnea

All too often, snoring and obstructive sleep apnea are found to be interrelated. So for any fitting treatment to be carried out, you must make sure that you are thoroughly diagnosed.

Nasal problems

Various biological factors may also lead to poor air flow through the nose. The nasal bridge or septum as technically referred to is the underlying factor. When there is nasal congestion or when it is out of shape (crooked), there are greater chances of snoring.

There are many different methods to control and cure snoring, but one of the best permanent cures for snoring is surgery.

It is best to detect the cause of snoring very early since it will be easier to cure it. It is not fatal or even very damaging on health but more you procrastinate, the more severe the condition is likely to get.

An average human spends almost half his life sleeping. We achieve whatever we can in the remaining hours. Many people are successful at sleeping well, but there are some who don't and some just can't sleep peacefully.

This is why we snore only while sleeping and not while we are awake. Our muscles like the rest of our body, relaxes when we sleep. People who snore are often advised to sleep lightly so that their muscles are kept tight.

Don't consume dairy products right before your bed time. These can lead to formation of mucus in the windpipe which further leads to snoring.

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Sleep on your sides. Lying on your back is well known to aggravate snoring.

Sleeping at a regular time everyday makes your body adjust its body cycle likewise. So even if you do snore, you will get a good night's rest. The lost sleep due to snoring can be compensated by developing a good sleep schedule and thoroughly relaxing your body.

Make your pillows harder. This makes your throat muscles tighten. Since only over relaxed muscles lead to snoring. So hard pillows can help alleviate snoring.

Keep your throat wet at all times to lessen this congestion.

Smoking eats away your lungs in the long run. In a short while itself, however, it alters the cells of your throat to make them tougher to adapt to the harsh substances in smoke. This causes snoring. Swelling and inflammation of the respiratory tract also arise from smoking.

Nasal strips which help a person breathe comfortably by clearing the air pipe are found to be effective at controlling snoring. Some people find anti snoring sprays and pills to be of greatest effect.

Contributing Factors And Subsequent Snoring Remedies

Snoring is the annoying drumming noise that is produced by the throat along with its various components when they vibrate. It does not occur when you are awake. But when you are asleep, these tissues relax and blocks the normal passage for flow of air. This narrowing of the passage and inhibition of normal air flow causes snoring.

All remedial measures to snoring involve probing the cause of snoring. Only when the cause is known, can any concrete steps be taken to cure it. If not, one has to somehow find out the cause. The following can be the causes.

1. Obesity

Sedentary life, rich food, junk food and physiological problems cause people to develop all the conditions that could eventually lead to snoring. Obesity is one of these conditions. It is well known that people who are overweight snore more than those who have their muscles toned. The fleshiness of their throat is the chief cause of this. This there is more blockade in their throats. To counter this, the overweight people are often advised to relieve themselves of a few extra pounds. Shedding these extra pounds not alone alleviates them of snoring, but also improves their overall health.

2. Drinking

Do not consume alcohol just before sleeping. If you do, then your throat muscles will over relax and droop into the airway blocking it. This aggravates snoring.

3. Smoking

Smoking modifies the cells in the throat among all its other ill effects. The throat generates more mucus to withstand the passage of smoke and nicotine through the air tract so that there will be no inflammation. But the accumulation of mucus itself causes a blockade to air and hence snoring occurs.

4. Sleep pattern

There are stages of sleep. Stage1 sleep is when a person just begins sleeping. Every time a person is disturbed, he goes back to stage1 sleep. The second stage is Rapid Eye Movement (REM) sleep where dreams occur

Normally those who snore have a very irregular breathing pattern arising out of the grunts of their bed mates.

One should have good sleeping habits and practice sleeping at around the same time everyday to prevent snoring. Since a body requires 8 hours to rejuvenate, it is recommended that you establish a good sleep pattern.

5. Sleeping habits

People who sleep on their back snore more than those who sleep in other positions. This is because when you sleep on your back, gravity causes your tongue to withdraw to the back of your throat. Apart from this, the tissues in the throat dangle and this air that passes has to push these muscles up to pass. This causes them to vibrate and cause snoring.

It has been observed that sleeping in an elevated position reduces chances of snoring. At an angle of 30 degrees, the tongue wont roll back and the diaphragm will relax well.

6. Medical Problems

Peaceful sleep is lost when you have a blockage in the throat. This can be caused by inflammation that arises from allergies or infection. Tonsillitis, large adenoids, accumulation of excess mass in the throat and modification in cell contraction can block the flow of air in the throat. Surgery is commonly advised for snoring that arises of these complications

The answer to quieting the rumblings of a snorer might be in that glass of milk they had with their dinner.

Milk contains materials that can produce mucous in some people. There's an old wives tale that suggests that if you have a head cold you shouldn't drink milk. The reasoning is that the milk will contribute to the build-up of mucous that is already present and make the person suffering from the cold that much worse. Their nose becomes stuffier, their chest might feel congested and it becomes more difficult to breathe.

It's that idea that leads some people to avoid the consumption of dairy products before bed. They believe that if they drink a glass of warm milk to help them fall asleep, that sleep will be riddled with the sounds of snoring. The milk producing mucous which becomes lodged within the throat passage and causes a narrowing which leaves less room for breathing, hence the resulting noise we refer to as snoring.

If you are dining later and consuming milk it might be worth noting if you snore that night or if you snore when normally you don't. If you do discover that this is true, than the next step would obviously be to restrict your dairy intake or to consume products from the dairy family earlier in the day so your body has time to digest them before bedtime. If you rely on the milk you are drinking with your evening meal as a form of daily calcium, perhaps try drinking it with breakfast or lunch instead. Those few hours might make all the difference in whether or not you snore.

Adults aren't the only ones who snore. Often you can hear your infant or child while they sleep. Their breathing perhaps not as loud as your spouses when they are snoring, but it's evident that the subtle drone coming from your offspring is snoring in some form. The idea that milk and dairy products contribute to snoring is illustrated by the fact that children do snore. They consume, on average, more milk than most adults. For a child who tends to develop mucous build-up their breathing might be even more pronounced after they've had a dinner that included several servings of dairy products.

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Although it's not wise to limit your child's intake of dairy if they are snoring, it could be a great and effective alternative for someone older. By choosing to take a calcium supplement as a replacement for a glass or two of milk, you could come out on the winning end by finding a peaceful night's sleep that's free of snoring.

The Connection Between Alcohol And Snoring

It's relaxing and pleasurable to hit the bar after work with some friends. It gives you a chance to unwind and share a cocktail or two before you head home to bed. That stop at the bar might be costing you more than the price of a drink or two though. It might be costing you a night that doesn't involve waking up tired.

Alcohol can cause snoring. By partaking of a drink or two you can be setting yourself up to snore. The reason is that when we drink our bodies become relaxed, this includes the muscles of the throat. Often when a person has drank a few cocktails they will fall into a very deep sleep, a very relaxed sleep which can result in very loud snoring. If you've ever been at a party or social gathering where someone has consumed too much alcohol and fallen asleep, you might remember that they were snoring, and if you told them after, they'd say that they don't snore. That just might be true often a person only snores when they have been drinking liquor.

To stop the snoring they need to first become aware that their drinking is contributing to the seriousness of the problem. For someone in a relationship, their significant other will probably complain enough about the sound of the snoring and its effects that no other reminder will be necessary. For others, it might be that their snoring wakes themselves up. This can occur if the snoring is particularly loud and the person is sleeping restlessly. They'll find themselves jolted awake and wondering what was the cause. The cause is almost always that the snoring has startled them enough to wake them from their slumber. It's very hard to recognize this yourself though, after all how can we hear ourselves snore when we are asleep, especially a very deep sleep that results from the relaxing effects of alcohol.

The best and easiest way to remedy snoring that is caused by alcohol consumption is to either drink less or in some cases, not drink liquor at all. If this isn't an acceptable option another alternative might be to switch to another type of drink. Some beverages contain a higher concentration of alcohol than others. If you are snoring because you've been drinking a few glasses of wine, switching to beer might greatly improve the situation.

Another approach to stopping your snoring when it's brought on by drinking is to eat more while you consume the alcohol. Eating while drinking spirits can help you absorb less of the alcohol into your system. For someone who snores because of alcohol this can be very significant, it

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allows them to drink while at the same time, their sleep that night won't be too deeply affected by snoring.

If snoring is being brought on because of that beer that you drink with your dinner, it might be time to switch to a soda or a glass of water. Weighing the pleasure of the drink against the possibility of stopping snoring is a personal choice.

Limiting Eating Before Bedtime Can Help Stop Snoring

It's getting to close to bedtime and your stomach is looking for a late night snack. You go to the kitchen and decide on a nice thick slice of chocolate cake. After brushing your teeth you tuck yourself into bed and within hours you feel the familiar hand of your spouse trying to wake you up so you'll stop snoring.

Snoring is a problem that almost everyone has had to deal with at some point. Whether it was a parent who snored, a partner or their own snoring problem, it changed not only their sleep patterns but their stress level as well. If we don't get a good night's rest we can end up irritated, frustrated and angry with the person who snores, even if logically it seems that there is nothing they can do about it.

There might be something that can easily change the situation and help them to stop snoring. The solution might be found in their menu. The foods we eat can have a direct impact on whether or not we snore.

Eating right before you retire for the night gives your body less of a chance to digest the food. This can result in the food sitting within your stomach and depending on the size of the snack or the meal it can also cause you to feel pressure on your diaphragm. It is that pressure that can result in snoring.

Adjusting your meal time might help improve the snoring. If you are accustomed to eating dinner later in the evening at eight or nine o'clock, it might be wise to move that ahead several hours so that by the time you do hit the hay, the food will have been digested and it won't result in a restless sleep that is filled with the sounds of snoring.

Experimenting a bit with eating times is wise in this case. It might be as simple as an hour difference in time that results in you snoring or not. That is a small change that can have a big result in not only your sleep but in the sleep of those who have listened to you snore night after night.

Snacks are often a regular routine of night time television viewing. Eating potato chips, popcorn or pretzels is a great way to add flavor to an evening of sports or movies. Choosing a different snack might help you to have a sounder sleep though. Some research suggests that honey has

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a positive effect on the airways and can help stop snoring. Eating an apple dipped in honey or having a cup of warm tea with honey will not only help with stopping the snoring but it won't place such a heavy burden on your digestive system at the end of the day.

Overall the main points to remember when eating to avoid snoring are:

- Avoid eating late in the day.
- Avoid eating snacks that contain too many calories
- Avoid snacks that take a long time to digest.

Looking carefully at your diet and your dietary habits might result in not only a healthier eating pattern but also may help with a snoring problem. Simply adjusting what you eat and when you eat it could stop your snoring completely.

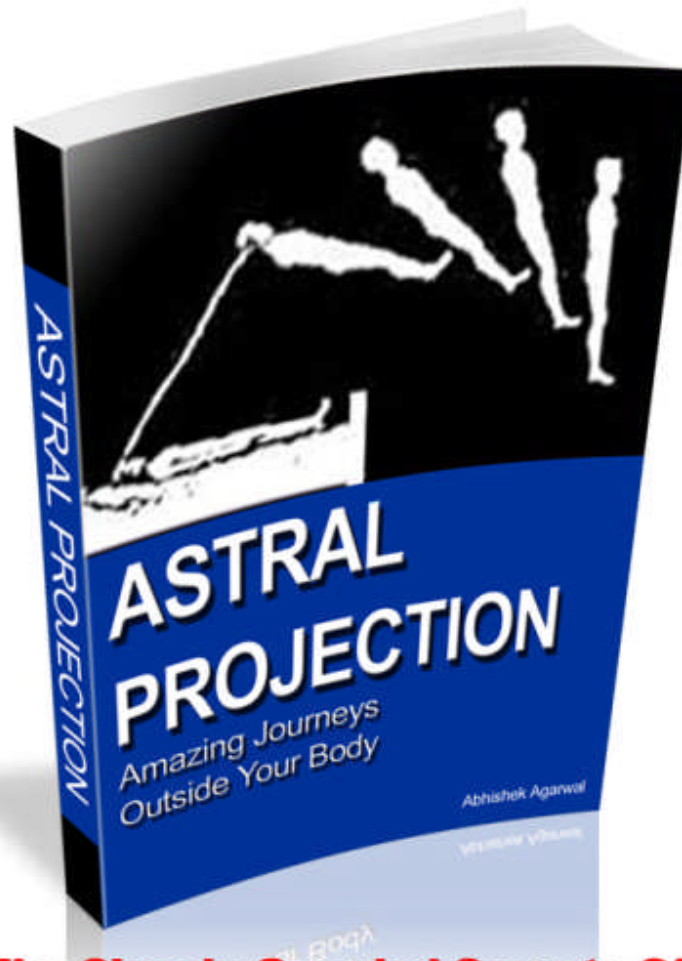
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
